

Hazard Communication / Personal Protective Equipment / Job Hazard Analysis /

Course objectives

Participants in this class will be able to prepare a Job Hazard Analysis (JHA) for tasks performed in their workplace. The JHA is a procedure for breaking down each task into steps, identifying the hazards associated with each step and selecting the method for eliminating or avoiding the hazard or protecting exposed workers.

OSHA requires an assessment wherever Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is required. Participants will be able to identify the type of PPE necessary for common hazards and the precautions necessary to insure the PPE is appropriate and properly worn and fitted.

A well written and administered Hazard Communication Program provides employees the knowledge to protect themselves when working with hazardous materials. Participants in this class will be able to identify the five major requirements of the standard, will recognize the hazard ratings on labels, and will be able to extract useful information from the Material Data Sheet.

Course Topics

- Performing a job hazard analysis
- JHA exercise
- Hand, head foot and eye protection
- Elements of the hazard communication program required by OSHA
- Information to look for on labels and MSDS
- MSDS exercise

This course is a stand-alone class and a component of the OSHA 10 and 30-hour course.
